# The Life of Christ

### A CHRONOLOGICAL STUDY OF THE GOSPELS

6<sup>TH</sup>-8<sup>TH</sup> Grade/Full Year Course 1 Elective Credit

## Course Description:

A comprehensive study of the earthly life and ministry of the Lord Jesus Christ. The course focuses on a chronological view of Christ's life and ministry as recorded in the Gospels with an emphasis on what it means to follow Jesus today.

#### Course Benefit:

The Apostle Paul wrote "Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ" (Phil. 3:8). Nothing compares to the joy of knowing Christ!

Students will learn the disciple-making method and model of Jesus and what it means to "walk in the same way in which he walked" (1 John 2:6).
