You are familiar with: verb conjugations on present tense, verb conjugations on past tense (preterite), adjectives, subject pronouns, reflexive pronouns, definite and indefinite articles, comparatives, imperative (tú form) and basic vocabulary (greetings, weather, family, months, days, numbers, food, activities, the school, the house, parts of the body, daily routine and clothing).



Why learn Spanish: Spanish is a language spoken in 21 countries and approximately 442 million people in the world. The demand for bilingual workers has been increasing in industries like Health care, Hospitality, Education, Law enforcement, Customer service, Social services, Finance and Communication. Spanish is the most popular non-English language spoken in USA with roughly 34 million speakers nationwide.
